The African Studies minor encourages students to undertake an inter-disciplinary study of Africa and the African Diaspora through coursework in a variety of scholarly disciplines and programs, including American Ethnic Studies, Anthropology, Archeology, Art History, Comparative History of Ideas, Comparative Literature, English, Forestry and Fisheries, Geography, Health Services, History, International Health, International Studies, Language Study, Music, Near-Eastern Studies, Political Science, Religion and Social Work. Courses for UW-Bothell and UW-Tacoma are listed following the UW-Seattle language courses.*

*To complete an African Studies minor, a student must take at least 30 credits of African Studies courses. Those courses must be spread across three or more disciplines/programs and 15 of the 30 credits must be at the 300-level or above.
