Carri Campbell is the Program Manager of Visual and Performing Arts of the Seattle Public Schools District. Strongly grounded in classroom teaching, Campbell received her undergraduate degree in elementary education from Western Washington University and her Master's of Education in integrated curriculum from the University of Washington. As a teacher in the Mukilteo School District, she integrated the arts into daily curriculum as an instructional method and developed an after-school art program. Before joining Seattle Public Schools, Campbell worked for ArtsEd Washington and was responsible for envisioning and implementing programs to help Washington schools meet state standards in the arts.
