Cleonice is a part of the Indigenous Peoples of Pankararu, from Aldea Conta Vermelha, in Jundiba, in the state of Minas Gerais.

Haroldo Heleno is the Coordinator of the East Regional Missionary Indigenous Council, working there for 31 years mostly in the south of Bahia, specifically with the Pataxó HãHãHãe, Tupinambá de Olivença e Belmonte, Pataxó in the far South. As the coordinator of the East region, he serves the Peoples of Minas Gerais, Espírito Santo, and Bahia.



Jonathan Warren is a Professor in the Henry M. Jackson School of International Studies. His teaching specializations include Education, Race, Ethnicity, and Nationalism, Cultural Studies, and Qualitative Research. Professor Warren has an extensive history of research in Brazil, including works on anti-racism and racial literacy.
