

Major in Jewish Studies Worksheet

Jewish Language. Students must do one of the following:

- Complete two years of college-level coursework in one Jewish language or demonstrate second year college-level proficiency in one Jewish language through a proficiency exam;
- Complete one year each of college-level coursework in two different Jewish languages or demonstrate first year college-level proficiency in two different Jewish languages through a proficiency exam.

- Minimum 35 credits of Jewish Studies courses from an approved list of electives, to include a minimum of 25 credits completed at the 300-400 level. May include a maximum of 10 credits from the second year of Jewish language courses.
- Maximum 15 credits (exclusive of language) from an approved UW study abroad program may be counted towards the major.
- Minimum 2.00 cumulative GPA for courses applied to the major.
