Law School Grading System

Effective Autumn Quarter 2003, the University of Washington School of Law adopted a new grading system. The following is the grading scale and the 4.0 scale equivalents.

The School of Law uses anonymous grading of exams. The grade for a non-law student will be submitted in the 4.0 scale equivalent of the grade submitted by the professor. For classes with exams (and some with papers) anonymous grading applies to non-law students as well as to law students. Non-law students are not graded on different criteria than law students.
