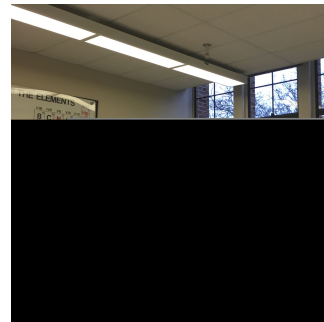

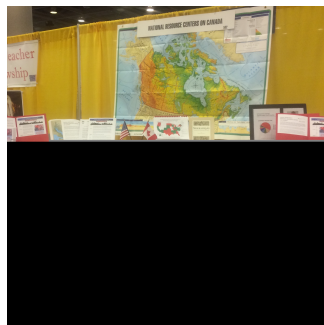

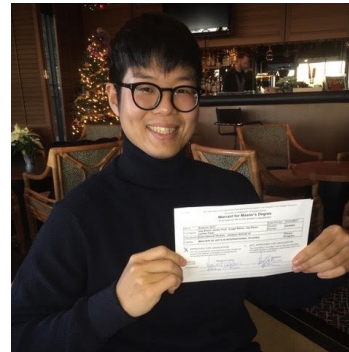
- **UW Undergrad Scholarships – Corbett British Columbia–Washington International Exchange Program Fund:** Applications are open for UW undergraduate students to study at the University of British Columbia or the University of Victoria in 2018–19, and for UBC or UVic students to study at UW. Scholarships for UW students are \$10,000 (U.S.); scholarships for UBC and UVic students \$12,000 (U.S.). Tuition is paid at the recipient's home institution. First eligible applicant, first awarded. - **UW Undergrad Scholarships – Killam Fellowships Program:** the 2018–19 competition for Fulbright Canada's undergraduate exchange program, the Killam Fellowships Program, is now open. The fellowship carries a value of \$5,000 U.S. for one semester, plus a health coverage allowance, and includes enrichment seminars in the fall and spring in Ottawa and Washington, D.C., respectively, and travel funding. 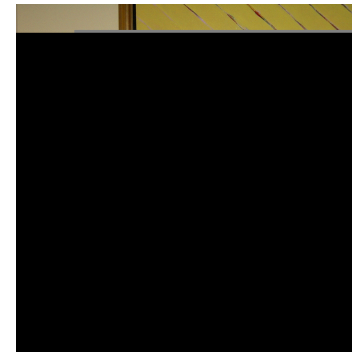
