New course on Indigenous food sovereignty

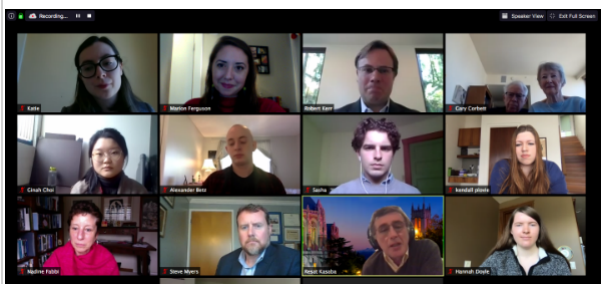
Charlotte Coté, American Indian Studies, received a development grant for a new course on Indigenous food sovereignty in our cross-border region. [MORE](#)
