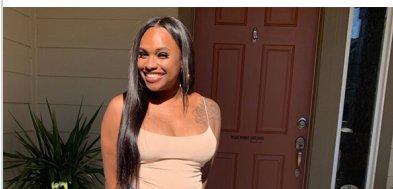
Eva Khosin
