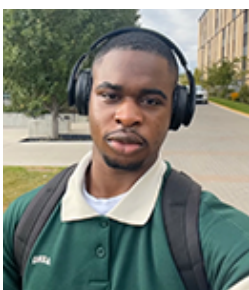

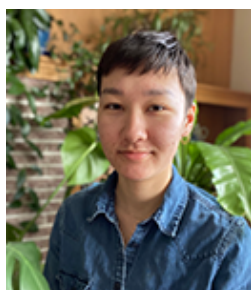
CORBETT AND KILLAM EXCHANGE STUDENTS

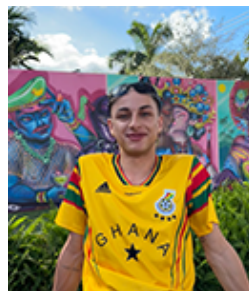
