On September 17, 2007, DHS received a Significant Incident Report (SIR) from (b)(6) in the Office of Refugee Resettlement (ORR) at Tumbleweed Center for Youth Development, Phoenix, AZ on behalf of (b)(6) a Honduran unaccompanied minor (UAC) (b)(6). (b)(6) alleges that on July 10, 2007, (b)(6) disclosed to him that while in ICE custody that day during transportation to the airport for removal, he was told that he would not be allowed on the flight because he didn't have a ticket. (b)(6) also disclosed that an unknown ICE officer mocked and made fun of him saying, "Lo siento que ahora no te vas a ir." (translation: I'm sorry that now you are not able to go). (b)(6) also stated that the officer told him that, if he didn't stop crying that he was going to be handcuffed. He described the officer as having a mustache, red shirt and blue jeans, being Chicano, and about 5'11" and 180 lbs. Youth Care Worker (b)(6) alleges that (b)(6) (b)(6) called her to advise that (b)(6) was not going to be on the deportation flight. She also alleges that she heard him say that other ICE officers were struggling with (b)(6) and overheard him say to them, "whoa, whoa, whoa just hold him down." When (b)(6) was returned to the FOCUSED house (Focused On Community, Unity, Success, Education and Development) at the Tumbleweed facility, (b)(6) (b)(6) accompanied by (b)(6) (b)(7)(C) allegedly reported that they did not have any problems with (b)(6). CRCL received a Significant Incident Report (SIR) from the HHS Office of Refugee Resettlement (ORR) on September 24, 2007 concerning the treatment of (b)(6). The juvenile was apprehended for Entering Without Inspection in San Francisco, California on April 6, 2007. On Friday, July 13, 2007 he left the ORR facility to be staged by ICE for a flight back to El Salvador. He returned to the same ORR facility in San Francisco on July 16, 2007, to the surprise of staff. The SIR is a summary of a statement the juvenile wrote in Spanish on July 17, 2007, and is included in the file. The minor went with several officers on July 13, 2007, for a flight to Phoenix, and was transported to a jail about two hours away. He was with two other adults in the van but they were separated; the two adults were in the front and he was in the back. The officers left them in the van with the windows up and the doors locked. The minor became scared because they were without air in the hot van, so he began to take his clothes off and when he could not bear it any longer, began hitting the door of the van. The officer didn't ever come back, so he continued hitting and kicking the van door until finally an officer came back. The minor apologized to the officer for hitting the door, but told him directly that they could die in the heat and to please put on the air conditioner. The complaint was forwarded by (b)(6) at Human Rights First. In the anonymous complaint, ICE detainees at the Elizabeth Detention Center in New Jersey, operated by Corrections Corporation of America (CCA), allege wide ranging issues with regard to conditions of detention. These include guards who are obnoxious or rude, officers who ask detainees for their snacks from the Commissary, guards who don't allow the practice of religion, snacks from the Commissary that are overpriced and expired, failure to provide detainees with note pads and writing instruments except for a fee, only 2 phones for 44 detainees, expensive local and long distance calls, no exercise rooms or recreational activities, no soap on some days, razors that are unclear, dirty laundry distributed to detainees, cold dorms with no extra blankets, 4-5 days to get medical care, the wrong medicines are dispensed, no dental care, handcuffed when taken to embassies, missed flights because of CCA officers, only 12 visitation booths for 300 detainees, ICE officers who don't show up for months at a time, and outdated information regarding phone numbers and addresses for embassies. Action Requested: An investigation into the specific conditions of detention alleged by the detainees. Summary: A complaint was filed by email with the IG, with a copy to CRCL, on 11-8-07. The complaint was forwarded by (b)(6) at Human Rights First. (b)(6) states that on January 13, 2010, officers entered his apartment without his consent, notice, or court papers. (b)(6) states that he informed ICE personnel that his immigration case was currently before the Board of Immigration Appeals, however, ICE personnel repeatedly disregarded the BIA process, and gave (b)(6) additional paperwork to sign related to his deportation and final order of removal. (b)(6) states that he was forcibly placed on a Delta flight to Cairo out of JFK; DHS employees dragged a handcuffed (b)(6) through the airport, pushing him on the right, left and backside, until he was placed on the plane. On the plane, his hands were cuffed behind his back to a belt fastened around his waist. After much discussion between the DHS officers and the captain of the plane, the captain determined that he did not want (b)(6) on his flight. (b)(6) was taken off the flight and escorted to the Elizabeth Detention Center for the night. Elizabeth Detention Center did not complete any health checks when (b)(6) arrived in their custody. (b)(6) was recharged, and taken back to Essex County Jail. NOTE: According to EARMS, (b)(6) is not an aggravated felon and is currently being held at the Essex County Jail. (b)(6) alleges that he has been denied medical attention for five days, starting August 17, 2012, for his persistent headaches, dizziness, nausea and sleeplessness. He states that he has a long history of cerebral trauma and had previously been hospitalized whenever these symptoms occurred (four times between 2001 and 2011). He alleges that the employees at CCA insisted he "stop being a pest" and threatened to put him in the "hole" (Special Housing Unit, segregation) if he kept complaining. On August 21, 2012, (b)(6) allegedly fell down a flight of stairs at the facility, resulting in bumps and bruises all over his body, including his head. He was taken to the hospital, but alleges that his headaches are now worse than before and that he is constantly dizzy, weak, and nauseous. (NOTE: Although the correspondence displays his name as (b)(6) at the inside address and on the mailing envelope, EARM shows that first name is (b)(6) and his last name is (b)(6). (b)(6) attached a letter from (b)(6) alleging that on October 12, 2012, he was taken from Krome to Miami International Airport for deportation (EARM notes his refusal to board aircraft), and ICE agents threatened to beat him up and hurt his arm and hand. (b)(6) claims that he was not allowed to make a phone call to his lawyer or fiancée, and was not given his clothes or money prior to the deportation attempt and upon return to Krome, his requests for medical treatment were not authorized until the following day. (b)(6) states that a second attempt at deportation was made (per EARM: November 2, 2011). (b)(6) again refused to board the aircraft due to not having weather appropriate attire, money, or telephone access. (b)(6) alleges that (b)(6)-(b)(7)(C) taunted him about going back to Germany and that several ICE agents were upset with him for refusing to take the flight back to Germany because they had viewed it simply as a vacation for themselves. (b)(6) states that he has been constantly discriminated against because he is not Hispanic and that Hispanic detainees have their medical requests granted in a more timely fashion than him and that he cannot go to Church anymore as services are in Spanish and he does not have a translator. Additionally, (b)(6) asserts that requests to move to a building where other people spoke English was denied, the "English TV" has been broken and only the "Spanish TV" is available, the temperature at Krome is kept at 62 degrees and detainees are not allowed to use blankets during certain time periods, and requests to work at the center have been denied. The submission, received by the OIG on July 18, 2013, alleges that the day before, July 17, 2013, at John F. Kennedy International (JFK) Airport in New York, New York, (b)(6) "refused" to board an aircraft to be removed and was then physically assaulted by four ICE officers. According to the attorney, (b)(6) was to have been placed on a flight to depart at 5:40 p.m. on July 17, 2013. He allegedly refused to board the plane, at which time he was "smashed into the side wall, knocked to the ground, beaten with hands and feet" by four officers. One officer of Asian descent "put his boot on his face and smashed his face into the ground". The attorney alleges (b)(6) had the officer's footprint imprinted on the right side of his face and that "he was also hit with either a gun butt or flashlight on the side of the skull. He was bleeding from the mouth and the nose at the end of the beating. He was in such bad condition he was taken to Jamaica Hospital". (b)(6) states that he has "photos of (b)(6) condition". Notes: According to EARM records, (b)(6) was transferred to Hudson County Jail in Kearny, New Jersey on July 17, 2013, then to York County Jail, Pennsylvania on July 22, 2013, then to LaSalle Detention Facility in Oakdale, Louisiana July 23, 2013, and then to Etowah County Detention Center in Gadsden, Alabama on July 31, 2013. (b)(6) is currently in ICE custody. An EARM record reports that (b)(6) contacted the ICE ERO Community and Detainee Helpline (CDH) on July 19, 2013 to report that he was physically assaulted by ICE officers as a result of his refusal to board the aircraft for removal. That EARM record does not specify the date of the alleged assault. No EARM record states that Mr. Kolami was hospitalized. By letter dated June 11, 2013, addressed to the Miami ICE Field Office in Plantation, Florida, copying CRCL, DHS OIG, and the ICE ERO Public Advocate, the ABA referred (b)(6) allegations that he was physically assaulted and verbally abused by ICE personnel on November 10, 2013, at Miami International Airport (MIA) in Miami, Florida, after he refused to be removed to Bangladesh because of his fear of persecution. In a letter dated December 1, 2010, addressed to DHS OIG, (b)(6) states that he was in an ICE Holding Office at MIA and refused to sign any documents presented before him by ICE officers because he had a pending motion in the immigration court and because he feared for his life if he was returned to Bangladesh. He alleges that ICE officers dragged him from the holding office to a DHS minivan that transported him to an American Airlines terminal, and then "dragged" him onto a plane full of passengers. (b)(6) refused to take a seat on the plane. He alleges that ICE officers "forced" him to sit, but he got up, still handcuffed. He claims that an (b)(6) punched him several times in his abdomen and private region to try to get him to sit, and an unidentified plainclothes ICE officer allegedly punched him several times in his right ribcage area because he refused to sit. (b)(6) also alleges that ICE officers cursed at him using profanity because he was not complying. (b)(6) states that various passengers and an (b)(6) video-recorded the incident. By letter to the ABA, dated April 6, 2013, (b)(6) provided copies of his earlier correspondence to DHS OIG describing his allegations of physical assault. (b)(6) stated that he reported this incident to the DHS hotline and was given ID# 95935 and DHS# 101111035. Following this incident, (b)(6) was led off the plane and taken to Krome Service Processing Center in Miami, Florida at 6:00 p.m. that day. He claims that he did not see a nurse until 11:00 p.m. that night. He jumped out of the rancher's truck and struck his head on the ground. BP agents witnessed the event, then provided first aid and called in HALO flight which transported the subject to a hospital. It may be that the alien's decision to jump was based on the presence of BPAs and his desire not to be deported, but their participation here, prior to his leap, was simply being present in response to a report of suspicious activity. The article states all 85 detainees were handcuffed and placed in waist and ankle chains from the time they left the detention center until they landed in Dhaka (a period of over 30 hours according to those interviewed). Several detainees said there were hundreds of ICE officers present during the removals and they were laughing or swearing at the detainees, and even filmed it on their iPhones.
