The course will address significant social and political responses to Western influence in the Middle East, including movements favoring elements of Western models (nationalism and feminism), and movements rejecting Western models (pan-Arabism and religious resurgence). No previous work on the Middle East is expected, although NELC/SISME 210 is recommended.

Their analysis will offer an alternative way to understand Middle Eastern people who speak those languages. Possible guest speakers, depending on availability, will be invited to talk on these themes. The course will be in English. No prerequisites.
